The Illinois State Beekeepers Association (ISBA) is a 501 (c)(3).

Our purpose and function is to promote interest in honeybees and beekeeping by encouraging good beekeeping in Illinois and to help preserve and protect the honey and pollination industry of Illinois.

The ISBA is the recognized voice of Illinois Beekeepers at the state and national levels with over 1,600+ members. Membership is open to all persons interested in Honey Bees.

ISBA works closely with the Illinois Dept. of Agriculture and its Apiary Inspection Program.

ISBA is an affiliate member of the American Beekeeping Federation (ABF)

ISBA Accomplishments:

- In 2010 the ISBA successfully lobbied passage of Public Act 096-1028; allowing beekeepers in Illinois to bottle and sell up to 500 gallons of honey off premises without the previous requirement of an inspected honey house.
- In 2011 the ISBA working in cooperation with the Illinois Department of Agriculture (IDoA) undertook the promotion of Driftwatch, which is designed to assist pesticide applicators in protecting honey bees from exposure to pesticide drift.

Driftwatch was acquired by Fieldwatch and Fieldwatch created a website called il.beecheck.org where spray applicators can check to see if there are apiaries in the vicinity of where they need to spray.

- We have been an influential partner with many municipal and county governments regarding zoning to allow beekeeping.
